Construction update

To prepare the site for future homes, we have demolished 11 of the former hospital buildings and progressed ground remediation.

As we approach the end of the year, works are winding down. Subject to approvals, the two smaller buildings near Hospital Road will be demolished and ground remediation completed as part of the next stage of works.

Our contractor is removing equipment and leaving the site in a safe condition by installing controls to limit dust, erosion and sediment run-off. We will continue to monitor the air, spray water to control dust when needed, maintain the Hospital Road verge and site vegetation, and use security cameras to monitor the site. Neighbours are safe to continue normal routines like keeping windows open, gardening or walking by the site.

Future development

Wollongong City Council is assessing our development application to create lots for 50 future homes that we submitted last year. Pending approvals, works to redevelop the site are expected to start in 2025, with lot sales starting in 2026.

Featuring homes designed to blend with the neighbourhood, including terraces, duplexes, manor homes and freestanding houses, the project will help to provide greater choice, affordability and housing security for a range of new residents. Ten percent of homes will be affordable rental housing for people on lower to moderate incomes, like key workers.

We will also deliver two parks with views of the coast, a new access street with around 58 street parking spaces in addition to private parking, and through-site pedestrian connections.




